During being the officer, I organized an associated dancing event, which had never been held in our dancing club's history. The event was conducted with the other six high school clubs, which is a special part of it because we usually only hold with the clubs on the same campus. This experience strengthens my ability to communicate again and honed my skills in coming up with fresh event themes by combining traditional elements with new ideas. Moreover, through collaborating with other high schools in organizing events, dealing with diverse individuals with varying ideas has also been a valuable skill I've developed, and I've improved my communication skills and learned how to efficiently exchange opinions. Also, I learned how to facilitate collaboration among team members with different perspectives as well. Overall, these experiences provided me with valuable insights into event planning, team management, and effective communication.

What other commitments do you have and how will you manage your time?

What student concerns do you feel the DASG should address?

Because this is my first quarter in De Anza, I have only spent approximately two weeks on campus and haven't noticed any serious concerns. While I found that there are limited water dispensers (the one for water bottles not for direct drinking) on campus, (or just because I'm not familiar with the campus). I can only find one at the entrance of the library, which could be inconvenient for students attending classes in buildings far from the library who may need to refill their water bottles during breaks. Based on the situation I found, I suggest that each building should have at least one water dispenser for students to use. (To emphasize again, I'm really unfamiliar with the facility and building on campus so far, the only two buildings that I went to are my classrooms so if water dispensers are already available in every building, I apologize!)


What student concerns do you feel the DASG should address?
