5. Regional and State Labor Market Data

Employment opportunities for individuals with bookkeeping/accounting skills exist in all companies regardless of size, type of business, or industry sector. The California Employment Development Department's Labor Market Information data projects total annual openings for accountants and auditors for the period 2006-2016 to equal 324 positions in the San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara MSA, an increase of 15.3%. The same data suggest that there will be 272 annual openings for bookkeeping, accounting, and auditing clerks, an increase of 9.8%. Similarly, projections for all of California indicate that there will be 9,340 annual openings for individuals with accounting and bookkeeping skills for the period 2008-2018.
