


# Why Early Alert?



Early Alert is designed for the early identification of students who may be experiencing academic difficulty, and to connect these students with campus resources that can provide the appropriate interventions needed for their success.

# Early Alert Process

- De Anza employee raises a concern thru Early Alert system
- An notification is sent automatically to the student and service or program
- The service or program connects the student with a counselor and notifies the instructor
- Once the counseling session is complete, the student and instructor receives a notification automatically



## Early Alert Data



### Early Alert launched in the fall 2021 with the following results:

- 210 Early Alerts raised
- 407 Early Alert Student Contacts
- 103 Early Alert Appointments
- 39 Faculty participated from
  - 17 De Anza Departments

#### \*Winter 2022 preliminary results:

- 120 Early Alerts raised
- 292 Early Alert Student Contacts
- 51 Early Alert Appointments
- 10+ Faculty participated from
  - 9+ De Anza Departments

### Spring 2022 preliminary information (April 06 - April 27)

- 210 Early Alert raised
- 84 Early Alert Student Contacts
- 12+ Faculty participated from
  - 9+ De Anza Departments
