<i>Response to Diversity Questions</i>	I come from a family of refugees. To this day, my family and I are unable to return to our homeland, obliging us to adapt in new areas and situations. At age twenty-one, I moved with my husband, who is also a Palestinian refugee, to the United States to pursue my masters degree. The first few years were a struggle. We traveled with no money, living in a bare and furniture-less home provided by the university. I spent hours each day attempting to improve upon the little English conversational skills I had learned in grade school. Not only did I have to overcome obstacles due to my previous situation, but I often faced prejudice and exclusion from those around me, because of my Muslim and Arab-American identity. When I began my studies, I also had just given birth to my first son. With no family in the United States, I worked day and night to manage my time with my studies, while taking care of my first- born baby son. Fast forward many years later, I gave birth to my youngest son (three months premature). Since he was born, we were met with obstacles in his mental and physical well-beings, which barred <i>[truncated at 200 words]</i> .
