

HEFAS (Higher Education for AB 540 Students) is an institutional and educational program that provides free services and creates a safe space for all with an emphasis on undocumented and AB 540 students. We are dedicated to empowering students, building leaders, promoting social justice, and advocating for higher education.

Our vision is to provide a safe space for undocumented and low-income students, to give them, their parents, educators, and community members alike, the tools needed to reach higher education regardless of the barriers they might face in their individual lives.

Our Story

Undocumented students lead efforts to launch HEFAS with these mayor events:

- 2009 An undocumented student club was formed called IMASS (Integral Movement for AB 540 Student Success)
- 2011 Students win 9k from mobilize.org to start HEFAS
- 2013 The HEFAS program was inaugurated, students get an office space
- 2015: First Annual HEFAS Summit was organized
- 2021 HEFAS wins a grant to start the UndocuSTEM Program
- 2022 New center space at the East Cottage!

Policies

- Non-Resident Tuition Exemption Form (AB540):
 - Allows undocumented students and non-California residents to qualify for in-state tuition.
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA):
 - Allows some individuals who entered the country as minors, and either entered or remained in the country illegally, to receive a renewable two-year period of deferred action from deportation and to be eligible for a work permit. Currently only renewals are being accepted.
- CA DREAM Act:
 - The CA Dream Act Application allows students to apply for state financial aid for programs in higher education.

Who is considered undocumented?

Undocumented people in the United States are foreign nationals who have come or been brought to this country without legal documentation as well as those who have overstayed their once active Visas. Students who fall under this criteria may be eligible for in-state tuition under California's AB540 bill - both in community colleges and universities.
