
A survey of LinC program students was conducted at the end of the Summer quarter in 2011. The survey was distributed to all students enrolled in the APALI LinC course which resulted in 39 valid respondents.

Important Highlights Include:

- 100% of respondents reported they would recommend this learning community to a friend or family member.
- 98% of respondents described the quality of their relationship with classmates in this learning community as "friendly, supportive and helpful" or "very friendly, supportive and helpful."
- 95% of respondents described the quality of their relationship with teachers in this learning community is "friendly, supportive and helpful" or "very friendly, supportive and helpful."
- 94% of respondents stated they worked with classmates during class "often" or "very often."
- 84% of respondents described their overall educational experience in this learning community as "very good" or "excellent."
- 56% respondents reported that they found out about the learning community by a friend, 23% by a counselor, 8% by a teacher, 8% by someone who came to their class and told them about it, 3% by online schedule of the classes, and 3% by a flyer.












