Subject: Kinesiology Student Demographics, 2023-24 to 2024-25

Overview:

Physical Education and Athletics division inquired about the headcount and demographics of its Kinesiology major students.

Methodology:


The data used in this report reflect all students enrolled between 2023-24 and 2024-25 and their primary major at the time of their enrollment. Students whose primary major was Kinesiology for Transfer were grouped to “Kinesiology” and the remaining majors were grouped to “Other Major.” Data for each academic year is provided and the reported findings focus on the aggregate of the two years being examined.

Results:

- **Headcount:** In 2023-24, there were 489 Kinesiology and 29,104 Other Major students. In 2024-25, their headcounts are 444 and 29,156 respectively.
- **Age:** Overall, Kinesiology students skew younger with 76% below the age of 25 with most of them between the ages of 20 to 24 (39%), followed by 19 or younger (36%). In comparison, 65% of Other Major students were below the age of 25.


Age Distribution



- **Gender:** Kinesiology students skew male (66%), whereas Other Major has similar representation of female (49%) and male students (49%).

- **Ethnicity:** Most Kinesiology students are Latinx (33%) or Asian (23%).
- Kinesiology has higher proportions of Black (6%), Filipinx (14%) and Latinx (33%) students than compared to Other Major students, 4%, 5% and 23%, respectively.
- Additionally, Kinesiology has lower proportion of Asian (23%) students than compared to Other Major students (41%).
