Welcome to ESL 261/ESL 461

In this class, you will improve your advanced academic listening and speaking skills, pronunciation, and conversation skills. In this class, you will be working independently and with your classmates using the class handouts, online lectures, podcasts, and interviews. You should be prepared to spend at least four hours per week outside of class doing homework, practicing and reviewing materials covered in class.

Student Learning Outcomes

- Produce comprehensible low advanced spoken English on academic topics through one-on-one, group, and public speaking situations.
- Demonstrate listening comprehension of a variety of low advanced materials, including academic lectures, newscasts, dialogues and interviews by taking notes and answering questions.

Prerequisites

ESL 251 or ESL 451 or a qualifying score on the English as a Second Language Placement Test.

Course Requirements

Listening to Academic Lectures, Podcasts, and Listening Reports

Every week, you will be assigned an online listening exercise which could be a video file to watch/listen to. You will watch or listen to this activity very carefully as part of your homework and complete both an audio (summary, opinion, and vocabulary practice) and a written report (answer to listening comprehension questions) on the exercise. Reports will be turned in on Canvas. Additionally, you will complete a quiz and participate in class discussions to verify your progress and completion of assignment.

<u>Recorded Speaking Practice:</u> There will be two types: In addition to the weekly Listening Activities, there will be a Midterm Recorded Presentation, and a Final Recorded Presentation: more details about each on a separate handout.

Attendance

Plan to attend every class and always arrive a few minutes before class begins. You must come on time to every class. Students who miss class any time during the first week will automatically be dropped. Students who miss more than one class meetings during the quarter will receive ZERO participation points, and it may result in failure of the class. If you are late to class, this counts as one absence. If you miss more than 30 minutes of class (either arriving late, leaving in the middle of class or leaving early) that counts as an absence. You may have one absence during the entire quarter.

Participation

It is very important that you come to each class prepared and on time. You will often work with your classmates in pairs and small groups to discuss homework and the lecture. Active participation is an important part of your grade, and it will be observed daily. Students who miss class will get ZERO participation points. Students who come to class but are quiet all the time or are constantly speaking their native language will get 1 point. To get full participation credit daily (3 points), you must come to class and actively participate in English by asking questions, volunteering answers, and collaborating with all classmates and the instructor.

Quizzes/Midterm/Final

Several quizzes, a midterm, and a final exam will be given to verify the progress of your listening comprehension, vocabulary acquisition, and pronunciation.

Homework

You will be required to turn in several homework assignments regularly. Late homework is not accepted.

Listening and Speaking Workshops

The Listening and Speaking Center at De Anza offers several workshops (8-12 students) weekly. The topics vary from pronunciation, presentation skills, cultural assimilation, discussions, video discussion, etc. You are required to attend <u>at least</u> 6 workshops during the entire quarter. You will write a report for each workshop and submit it on Canvas. Three workshops will be turned in **on the day of the midterm exam** and an additional three will be turned in **on the day of the final exam**. Reports must be detailed and at least 8 sentences long (See additional handout for information).
