#### **EVALUATION:**

The lowest score (or the exam not taken, in case of absence) will be dropped in determining your final grade for the quarter, for a total possible 200 points.

Each chapter will have 10 homework points available from the end of the chapter exercises for a <u>total possible 60 points</u> (2 lowest assignments will be dropped in grade computation). Homework assignments will be accepted only on the due date at class time. Late work receives 0 points.

<u>The final exam is worth 50 points and is comprehensive (Cumulative of all chapters)</u>. It will cover all the chapters covered in the quarter.
