### **Course Description**

This course will focus on the development of English speaking, listening, reading and writing skills, with an emphasis on grammar instruction. Students will practice writing simple, compound, and complex sentences, as well as short paragraphs. They will develop reading comprehension, vocabulary-building skills, and oral communication skills.

#### **Course Pre-requisite**

To enroll in this class, you need to achieve a qualifying score on English as a Second Language Placement Test or pass ESL 234/444 with a grade of C or better.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes**

- Comprehend, analyze, and respond to intermediate-level reading and listening materials.
- Write a group of topic-related sentences using level-specific grammar and vocabulary.
- Demonstrate understanding and usage of level-specific grammar and vocabulary across reading, writing listening, and speaking tasks.

# **Course Objectives**

- Listen to, comprehend, and infer meaning from dialogues, conversations, discussions, and listening passages.
- Speak appropriate American English in given situations.
- Read, comprehend, and analyze intermediate level reading passages.
- Write a group of topic-related sentences using level-specific grammar and vocabulary.
- Expand vocabulary with emphasis on high-frequency words and words from the academic word list.
- Discuss and analyze cross-cultural customs and attitudes, especially in contrast with the students' native customs and attitudes.
