Transition to 'sustainability': What to do when the 'work is not honored'	D/A	All	 Now that we have established 'proficiency' in outcomes work, it is reasonable to suppose that the majority of the campus is well aware of the SLO process, and of th responsibilities as participants. As we shift toward a sustainable SLO model on campus, it is time to discuss some the difficult questions that have been tabled until now: How exactly will non-participation be handled? How should we address SLO work that is submitted, but beneath reasonable quality standards? Two broad strategies were discussed. First response to non-participation should be <i>investigative</i> in nature—i.e. meet with department members to determine <i>why</i> the work is not being done. The second step is still up for discussion, but we must not lose sight the fact that we have worked very hard to establish a non-putative culture of assessment on campus. Any means taken to enforce participation should keep this in mind. Suggestions offered include Emphasizing the role of outcomes data in PBT decision-making Tying SLOAC work more directly to the conference/travel stipend process Institutional recognition for excellence in assessment work
